Welcome to our May 2024 Newsletter!

This month, our theme is 'Amazing Animals' and the children will focus on: recognising and naming animals; where in the world they are from; pets and how to care for them.

Some of our older nursery friends will be leaving us in the summer to start school. We will slowly begin the transition to school this month by encouraging the children to be independent in tasks such as putting Our key fiction text is: 'Dear Zoo' by Rod Campbell.



Our Pedagogical Approach

Communication and Language Development: During their play and group time, children will learn how to add more detail to their sentences by being asked 'why' questions and being encouraged to ask these also. This will also encourage children to organise their play.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development: Children will be learning about 'Relationships'. We will be talking about our families and friends. We will be discussing how to treat our friends, what happens when we feel upset and what makes a good relationship.

Physical Development: During their play and group time, the children will continue to become secure in their independence skills such as putting their own shoes and coats on. Children will also use tools for fine motor skills more accurately such as scissors.

Literacy: Children will continue to develop their phonological awareness through hearing initial sounds in words. Mark making and name writing will also be a focus to prepare our older children for reception.

Maths: In Maths, our focus number is five and the children will link this to their prior learning of 1, 2, ,3 and 4. We will begin the concept of time through days of the week and sequencing daily events. Capacity will also be explored through continuous provision.

Children Feel Emotions Differently!

If you've ever witnessed a temper tantrum, you know how devastated a toddler can seem over the smallest thing. But this isn't just for show studies tell us that toddlers feel emotion in a more full-body way than adults do.

Children don't always know that emotions are temporary. They may feel trapped in a certain emotion, without the understanding that it can come and go. It might even be hard for them to articulate how they feel about a situation, making it more of a struggle for them to do anything about it.

At nursery, children learn to manage their emotions. Once they're in an environment with other children and a variety of adults, they'll have many more models of how to move and interact in the world.

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Little Bean's Recipe of the Month

Ratatouille Risotto

----- INGREDIENTS

- 400g risotto rice
- 1 tbsp butter
- 1 courgette finely chopped or grated
- 1 pepper finely chopped or grated
- 1 aubergine (small) finely chopped or grated
- 1 onion finely chopped or grated
- 1 carton of tomato passata
- 1 tin chopped tomato
- 1 tbsp ground garlic
- 1 vegetable stock cube
- 200ml Boiling water

----- METHOD

- 1. Simmer the rice with the butter for several minutes in a pot, stirring often to prevent sticking.
- 2. Add the stock cube to the boiling water, then add to the rice and mix well.
- 3. Once the rice has absorbed the water, add chopped tomato.
- 4. Once the rice has absorbed the tomato water, add tomato passata.
- 5. Cook for several minutes, then add the vegetables and ground garlic.
- 6. Continue simmering and adding boiling water in small quantities, allowing the rice to absorb the water before adding more water, until the rice is at the desired consistency and cooked.
