----- WE WILL BE LEARNING ABOUT LIFE IN SPRING, MINIBEASTS AND APRIL SHOWERS.......

There will be wonderful learning experiences in April and the children will learn about:

Easter

- We will celebrate Easter by listening to songs and stories about Easter
- Participate in our Easter Bonnet Parade
- Develop an awareness of Easter symbolisms e.g. Easter bonnets, bunnies, carrots, eggs, chicks.

Growth and New Life

- Name and identify baby animals on the farm.
- Develop an awareness of new life in Spring e.g. buds on trees, flowers in gardens, frogs and chicks.
- Observe first-hand the lifecycle of a butterfly.
- Develop an awareness of stages of their own personal growth from baby to now.
- Develop understanding of care of babies and develop empathy towards them.
- Develop understanding of planting processes of vegetables and flowers.
- Participate in a wide range of planting activities and begin to understand the planting and growing process.

Minibeasts

- Develop respect for living things and learn how to care for mini-beasts i.e. caterpillars as they transition to butterflies.
- Name a variety of mini-beasts and their body parts e.g. wing, leg, antennae.
- Become familiar with minibeast's habitats and their environment (fields, lakes, pond, river, flowers, moss etc.).
- Count the number of legs etc. of the various mini-beasts through their play, songs, rhymes and stories.

29th April - International Dance Day


A celebration day for those who can see the value and importance of the art form "dance". The Little Beans will try out all their dance moves!

CORE BOOKS

-- Happy reading




We have chosen specific 'core books' which we want our children to know well by the time they leave nursery. These books are the type of books that can be re-visited again and again, on different levels to support language development.

The idea is that children will develop language and increase vocabulary in addition to gaining a love of books and will become very familiar with these known texts so that they can remember and re-tell them.

Our shared reading plan includes strategies which encourage the children to join in, so that the experience of reading becomes interactive and the children begin to learn the story as they are read to. In each book there is lots to discuss so that the children understand the vocabulary as well as what is happening.

All of our core books have pictures, which support the text but also compliment and add to it. We discuss the pictures and what is happening in them as much as the text. We find our children learn parts / all of the books word for word after a while, which can give them great confidence as early readers in terms of fluency when reading.

This term we will be focusing on 'Jack and the Beanstalk' & 'The Hungry Caterpillar' to extend the children's interest in growing and mini-beasts.









Little Bean's Recipe of the Month

Vegetable Stir Fry

----- INGREDIENTS

- 1 Carton of Tomato Passata
- 1 Vegetable Stock Cube
- 20ml of Soy Sauce
- 1/2 tbsp of Ground Garlic
- 1 tbsp of Chinese 5 Spice
- 250g of Mixed Vegetables
- 200g of Rice or Noodles

Top Tip:

If you want to add chicken or pork, fry the meat separately in a little oil until cooked through and then add to the noodle and vegetable mix after step 5

----- METHOD

- 1. Boil the rice or noodles for 15 minutes then add the vegetables and boil for a further 15 minutes.
- 2. Drain the noodles and vegetables and then add the passata and soy sauce, mix well.
- 3. Simmer on a medium heat for 10 minutes.
- 4. Add the spices to the mixture and simmer for a further 15 minutes.
- 5. Add boiling water if necessary.

quack, quack,


