#### This month..... we will be exploring Space and Planets!

This term, our Little Beans will be blasting off into the fascinating world of space and planets! Through this cosmic adventure, they'll begin to appreciate the wonders of the world we live in and learn how we can all do our part to look after our precious natural resources.

Learning about space is all about embracing the unknown – encouraging imaginative thinking, posing "what if" questions, and nurturing those wonderfully curious minds.

We'll be carrying out simple experiments, making observations, and exploring why things happen the way they do. It's a brilliant way to introduce scientific thinking in an ageappropriate and exciting way.

We'll be investigating questions like, *Which is the biggest planet?* and *ls the moon really made of cheese?* – sparking giggles while also fuelling inquisitive learning.


As part of our journey, children will be introduced to the world of non-fiction, discovering how to find out real facts about our universe. We'll be using books, videos, and the internet to help us learn the names of the planets, and uncover fascinating facts – did you know Saturn has over 60 moons?





In each colorful image, Mister Seahorse's pouch grows bigger and bigger. In the meantime, the reader sees all sorts of camouflaged underwater sea life and the title character meets many friends along the way.

A cardigan or small jumper is also advisable, because it can still be chilly on cloudy days and in the afternoon when the shade has come over!



We'll also explore why space matters to us here on Earth – from understanding day and night, to discovering how Jupiter helps protect our planet by pulling in wayward comets.

#### **Getting ready to write**

-----building the foundations

Handwriting is a complex skill that begins long before a child picks up a pencil. To write successfully, children first need strong *postural control* – the ability to sit upright and move their arms and hands with stability and co-ordination.

This control begins developing from birth, with milestones like lifting the head, rolling over, and pushing up during tummy time, which also supports shoulder strength.

Before children can hold a pencil with their fingers, they need to isolate their fingers from their palm. Early pencil grips involve the whole hand, and as fine motor skills improve through playdough, messy play, and finger rhymes like "Two Little Dickie Birds", children gain better finger control.

*Mark making* is a key step before writing - activities like tracing, colouring within lines, and drawing simple shapes (lines and circles) help prepare children for forming letters.

By supporting these early steps through fun, hands-on activities, at Little Beans we help children become confident and capable writers.

## Little Bean's Recipe of the Month

### Pizza Pinwheels

#### ----- INGREDIENTS

- Pack of puff pastry
- > 1 tin of chopped tomatoes
- > 1 tbsp tomato puree
- ➢ 100g cheese
- ➤ 1 pepper
- $\succ$  1 tin of sweetcorn
- ➤ 1 pineapple
- ➤ 1 packet of ham
- > 1 packet of mushrooms
- > 1 packet of cherry tomatoes chopped
- Non-stick baking tray

#### Top Tip:

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If you have any left-over toppings you can put them on skewers and cook them in the over or BBQ them to make a delicious snack.

#### ----- METHOD

- 1. Preheat the oven on 180 degrees, gas mark 4.
- 2. Cut the ready rolled puff pastry into thin strips.
- 3. Pour the tin tomatoes into a bowl and mix in the tomato puree. Use a fork to break up the big chunks of chopped tomatoes.
- 4. Use a spoon to place some of the tomato mix onto each strip of pastry.
- 5. Grate the cheese and sprinkle on top of the tomato mixture.
- 6. Then it's time to add your toppings, cut up your choice of toppings into small pieces and place them on top.
- 7. Starting from one end, roll the pastry up into a wheel.
- Place on the baking tray and cook in the oven for 20 mins or until the cheese is melted.
